Tour Permit Change

Effective March 1, 2011, what are currently known as local and national tour permits will be superseded by what will be called the tour plan. ***The online tour permit system will be suspended.** This update is the accumulation of work by a cross-functional team of volunteers and staff including the Health and Safety Support Committee, Council Solutions, Outdoor Program Group, and Risk Management Advisory Panels. Units complete this form when planning for local, national, or international adventure. The plan helps ensure the unit is properly prepared, that qualified and trained leadership is in place, and that the right equipment is available for the adventure.

The tour plan consists of a tour planning worksheet to be completed by the unit/contingent. It is retained by the council and a tour plan is returned to the unit after processing.

There is a 21-day advance notice requested for units to submit the plan for review.

Defined reasons/times when a tour plan must be submitted for council review:

- a. Trips of 500 miles or more
- b. Trips outside of council borders not to a council-owned property
- c. Trips to any national high-adventure base, national Scout jamboree, National Order of the Arrow Conference, or regionally sponsored event
- d. When conducting the following activities in council but **outside of council or district events:**

- • Aquatics activities (swimming, boating, floating, scuba, etc.)
- • Climbing and rappelling
- • Orientation flights (process flying plan)
- • Shooting sports
- • Any activities involving motorized vehicles as part of the program (snowmobiles, boating, etc.)

New Health Forms

The Annual Health and Medical Record has been updated for 2011 see the following for helpful information for this transition.

The Annual Health and Medical Record is required for participation in all Scouting events, including day and resident camps and high-adventure bases. It should be updated no less than annually.

Highlights/changes with the 2011 update:

The record now lives on an interactive web page on Scouting Safely. Scouts, Scouters, parents and staff can download, fill in, and print it on standard paper, and can save an electronic copy for their personal files. Parts A and B-the health history and release statement-will be utilized the most.

Part C is the physical exam.

Part D is a review piece for participants attending any of the national high-adventure bases.

NEW Wilderness and Remote First Aid course using American Red Cross Materials

The American Red Cross Wilderness and Remote First Aid Course are new. It has been developed in conjunction with the BSA and is based on the 2010 BSA Wilderness First Aid Curriculum and Doctrine Guidelines. NOTE: The Boys Scouts of America requires at least one adult leader be Wilderness and Remote First Aid certification for all of its high-adventure camps and other programs, however more certificated scouters the better. This sixteen-hour course uses a combination of classroom, skills practice, and role-play in scenarios to teach the response steps and treatment of injuries and illnesses in a delayed-help situation. Major portions of Wilderness and Remote First Aid are designed to be taught outdoors. Here are some of the areas that would be talk about Wilderness and Remote First Aid, First Aid Kits, Secondary (Focused) Assessment, Calling for Help and Evacuation Considerations, Heat-Related Illnesses, Shock and Heart Attack, Chest Injuries, Wounds and Wound Infection, Allergies and Anaphylaxis, and many other topics.

The course will take place at Rainbow Camp, Morris, Illinois. It will begin with arrival at Rainbow camp at 5:00 p.m., Friday, April 8, 2011 to set up and get a moment to meet each other and end at approximately 5:00 p.m. Sunday, April 10, 2011. The cost for the course is \$125 .00 for the weekend which includes all meals, council camping fees, and course materials. New course materials include an Emergency Reference Guide structured around the course content and a weather resistant pocket guide for easy access on outings.

Course pre-requisites: Minimum age of 14, Adult CPR/AED certification (Adult and Child CPR/AED recommended or a higher level)(from American Red Cross or American Heart Association), Ability to learn and perform advanced first aid and other physically-demanding skills, such as evacuating an injured victim. These are Red Cross requirements - no exceptions. No re-certifications, this weekend is for Wilderness and Remote First Aid Course only.

Payment of the course fee is not a guarantee of certification. To be eligible for course certification you must: Successful completion of the course requires that the participant attend all class sessions, participate in all skill sessions and activities, demonstrate competency in all observable skills, complete the scenarios, and final written examination. Certification is valid for 2 years.

Registration is limited to the first eighteen paid registrants. Once materials are ordered, no refunds will be made, however substitutions made in advance will be allowed. Deadline for registration is the close of business hours March 1, 2011.

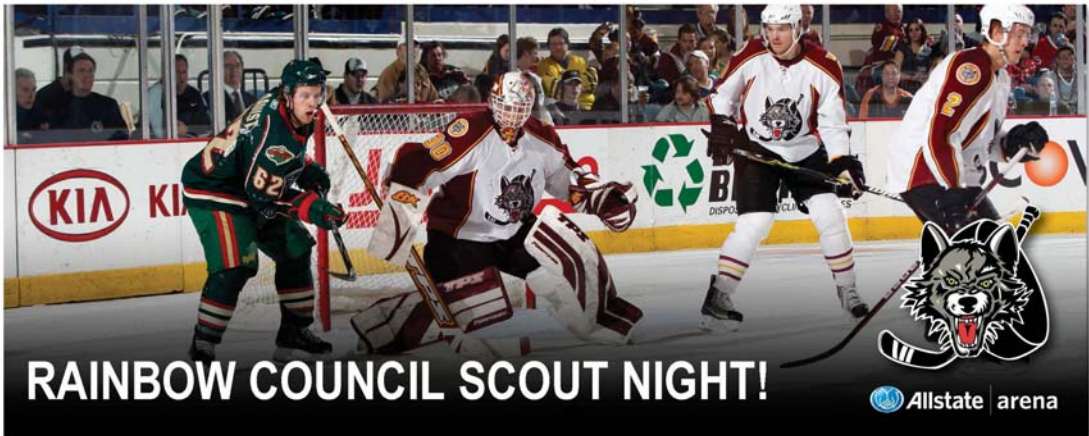

District Award of Merit Nominations

The District Award of Merit is the highest honor that a district can bestow on one of its volunteer Scout leaders. This is awarded at the District Dinner in March. District Award of Merit recognizes exemplary service to youth in through Scouting. While Scout leadership is a central requirement for this award, service to youth outside of Scouting--through church, sports leagues, other youth groups, etc.--is also considered as part of the nominee's total service to youth.

There is no tenure requirement (no minimum years of service) for this award. This acknowledges that some people make an impact by steady service over a period of years while others may have a major impact on Scouting through one, extraordinary act or other significant actions over a shorter period of time.

This award cannot be sought. Rather, it is earned through service but can only be presented to those who are nominated by one of their peers. Scouters should give careful consideration to those who truly exemplify the highest and best parts of Scouting and who cheerfully and tirelessly serve the youth in their care.

It is time to start nominating your fellow Scouters for this honor. The deadline for all nominations is **February 11, 2011**. Please send all nominations to Rainbow Council Ishkote District Award of Merit Selection Committee c/o Ryan M. Gust at 2600 N. Winterbottom Road Morris, Illinois 60450. The selected winners will be presented the award at the District Dinner on March 12, 2011 *Location is TBA*.

***Note: Please indicate on the back of the Nomination Form an Award Recipient liaison with email/phone contact. In the event this person is chosen as a winner the liaison can act on behalf of the winner to get them to the dinner, so is not to compromise the confidentiality of the nominee's outcome.*
